GRADUATE COUNCIL REGULATIONS REGARDING COMMITTEES:

The Doctoral committee consists of at least three UC Academic Senate members, with a tenure-track faculty member from the student's major (home) department serving as chair or co-chair. At least two members of every doctoral committee must be tenure-track faculty. The majority of the three members shall be from the student's UCSB major (home) department. Recommendation of the appointment of additional members to the doctoral committee is at the discretion of the department.

Students are eligible to advance to candidacy after completing the required coursework and the paper and examination requirements.

Three months after advancing to candidacy, the student will present to their committee a 5-10 page thesis prospectus, along with a bibliography.

This is a public event (i.e. faculty and anyone interested may attend).
